

2026 Year 11 Diploma Criteria

To gain a Lincoln High School Year 11 Diploma, a student needs to meet all the following criteria:

1. Obtain an overall average attendance rate of 97% or more, for all 2026 timetabled periods including Linc periods.

2. Obtain an overall 70% academic success rate that includes all 2026: a
 - Non-NCEA assessments
 - Learning and Behaviour Completion report grades
 - NCEA assessments including the NCEA literacy and numeracy digital exams.

Notes:

- a) The following grades count towards a student's academic success rate:
 - Non-NCEA topics – Emerging, Developing, Consolidating, Proficient, and Exceeding
 - NCEA topics - Achieved, Merit and Excellence

 - Learning & Behaviour report grades – Well Above Expectations (4), Meeting Expectations (3), Below Expectations (2), Well Below Expectations (1)

Please see note g) for an example of a success rate calculation.

- b) If a student gains a Year 11 and Year 12 diploma, they are eligible to gain a Graduation Diploma with Distinction in Year 13.

- c) Due to exceptional circumstances, a student who has not met all the criteria may be eligible for Principal discretionary consideration.

- d) The attendance rate is based on the periods attended or that have justified absences (e.g., medical absences or appointments, school events and trips, etc). Absences that reduce the diploma attendance rate include unexplained absences, truancy, holidays during term time, and unjustified absences in accordance with the Ministry of Education requirements.

- e) In instances where a period of absence for 10 days or less may affect a student's ability to receive their diploma, and this absence is for family reasons, the student's Tutor and Head of Level may apply discretionary consideration, provided the student has demonstrated a satisfactory attempt to catch up on learning missed during this time.
- f) The Year 11 diplomas will be presented at the Year 11 awards ceremony on Tuesday 8th of December 2026.
- g) Involvement in an ongoing or a significant behavioural issue may result in a student not being invited to the Year 11 awards ceremony.
- h) Example of the Diploma Academic Success Rate calculation

Grade Types	Score	Maximum Points Available	Diploma Points Earned
1) Overall Learning & Behaviour average from reports	3.1 (<i>Learning</i>) + 3.3 (<i>Behaviour</i>) = average 3.2 out of 4 = 80%	40	80% of 40 = 32
2) *Assessments (Non-NCEA & NCEA Assessments)	28 out of 40 assessments <i>passed</i> =70%	60	70% of 60 = 42
Total			32+42 = 74% Academic Success Rate
